### CATEGORIES

Please select one of the following categories. Nominees must be active, operational members of the SES to be eligible.

- Peter Keillor Award**  
In honour of former Murray SES volunteer Peter Keillor, this award is presented annually to a volunteer who has gone beyond the call of duty in demonstrating a high level of dedication and commitment to the SES.
- Team Achievement Award**  
Awarded to a SES unit or team who have initiated a new idea, worked collectively to achieve outstanding results in a particular area or undertaken a community awareness project.
- Youth Achievement Award (volunteers 16–25 years)**  
Awarded to a volunteer under the age of 25 years who has made a valuable contribution to their unit.

### CRITERIA

Nominees need to have met at least one of the following selection criteria to be eligible.

- Dedication to duty beyond normal expectations
- Involvement in the development or implementation of a SES awareness or prevention program (e.g. community safety activity, recruitment drive)
- Contribution to the efficiency, effectiveness and development of the SES through ingenuity and innovation (e.g. new safe work practice, new training method, new procedures)
- Demonstrated excellence in preparedness, response and safety at an incident
