About the program

The Volunteer Leadership Program (VLP) is a dynamic, immersive residential two-day (two night) program for emergency sector volunteers with aspiration and aptitude to support their organisation's leadership. It is a personally challenging and richly rewarding experience aimed at providing you with the foundations for capability and confidence for leadership. In taking part, you will be part of a collaborative learning experience, participating alongside volunteer leaders from other emergency management focused agencies, and generating knowledge and sharing experience.

The VLP introduces practical leadership frameworks through the use of interactive activities led by engaging and experienced facilitators.

The program covers skills for you to **improve awareness of your team, yourself and others** including:

- leadership and management strategies in your volunteer agency context
- contemporary issues facing the emergency management sector
- leading change in your organisation
- building and maintaining motivation of volunteers
- identifying (and working with) different personality types
- resolving conflict, addressing performance issues and giving critical feedback
- identifying stress and self-care strategies

Each program allows for additional topics to be incorporated based on the unique interests and needs of each group.



Can you participate?

To be considered for the VLP, applicants must meet the following criteria:

- Be an active emergency service sector volunteer in, or aspiring to, a leadership role.
- Have the time and agency support to attend the VLP and be prepared for approximately two hours of pre-course work.
- Be available to participate in a program that commences early evening on Friday and concludes mid-afternoon on Sunday.
- Answer all questions on the application form, demonstrating a vision for emergency management in Australia
- Submit application by the closing date (typically 30 days prior to the commencement of each course e.g. a course on 30 November, will close on 30 October).

Successful applications will be advised of their place as soon as possible and at least two weeks prior to each course.

What should you do next to attend?

- Fill in the application form and submit it by the due date (early submissions recommended)
- Seek the endorsement of your agency manager to attend the program (see below)

AIDR will select participants for each program based on the criteria outline above. In the event that the event is over-subscribed, AIDR will seek to offer eligible applications a place at future programs or place them on a wait-list for a place at short notice.

What is provided?

The course costs are met by AIDR and include:

- Twin-share accommodation for out of town guests at the venue (Friday and Saturday night).
- Dinner on Friday and Saturday nights, and all meals and snacks during the day.
- Car parking as required/available.

Where available, participants may request a single room at an additional cost of \$67 per night payable by either themselves or their agency. The availability of single rooms is not assured.

AIDR encourages applications from across Australia for any of the courses, although travel costs are typically the responsibility of the agency or individual. Occasionally, AIDR may agree to meet limited additional costs, including single room accommodation or some travel assistance for those with a specific need. Any requests for additional support must be included when you apply.

AIDR will endeavour to accommodate any dietary requests stated when you apply and menus are typically available for vegetarian, low fat and gluten-free diets.

What is not provided?

- Any booking at the venue outside these arrangements.
- Drinks and food from the bar, any room expenses, or other venue services such as Wi-Fi.
- Sometimes the venue cannot assure parking or dietary requests. AIDR will notify participants of these arrangements in advance.
- If in any doubt on course, please direct any enquiries to the facilitators who are staying with you.
