It has been brought to the SES Volunteers Association attention that the details recorded for some SES Volunteers are very inaccurate.

Thanks to the release of the new Volunteer Hub, SES Volunteers can now for the first time, easily check the details DFES have recorded for them.

From reports sent to the SES Volunteers Association, in quite a few cases these details are extremely inaccurate.

We have been advised that if you wish to correct the details you should contact your Local Manager, who will then contact his/her DFES DO, who will then verify the data submitted and if they feel it is correct, request the relevant person in DFES to change the records.

The SESVA believe DFES should be contacting Volunteers and verifying the information they have recorded for Volunteers, and thus simplifying the process and reducing the work load on SES Volunteers..
