- Assisted in the shooting of the Bunnings Video and Poster for the 2016 Great Aussie day BBQ,
- Actively working with DFES staff including the Chief Superintendents, Director for Media & Corporate
 Communications, Deputy Commissioners and Commissioner on many issues for improvement to the
 delivery of service to the key stakeholders Volunteers and Community.

We all know that there are often disasters at this time of the year, however, even though the SES Volunteers traditionally take a break over Christmas, they have a high level of preparedness and networks in place to respond immediately, if an emergency event happens.
