# NDRC 2024 – WA SES TEAM SYDNEY BOUND

State Emergency Service and Territory Emergency Service teams from across Australia will be in Sydney at the end of the month for 2024 National Disaster Rescue Challenge.

After a late start, the preparation for the NDRC is now in full swing for the WA Team which is made up of metropolitan based SES volunteers. The team have been busy training in various capabilities to be as well prepared as they can.

#### TRAINING AND TEAM BUILDING

Training is conducted weekly on Saturdays and the fundamentals were certainly a focus in the first few weeks with training now being directed towards scenarios that the team might see during the event in Sydney. Some of the training has included – power tools, flood boat operations, rescues from heights, mass casualty management, incident management, first aid and decision making.

### **LEADERSHIP**

Mark Geary from Gosnells SES is the appointed Team Leader, having accepted the role reluctantly. The team and Team Manager overwhelmingly saw Mark's leadership, analytical skills and decision making a key component in bringing the team together as a cohesive unit and to compete. Mark has participated in varying roles in previous NDRCs including Team Manager, Team Member and Stand Manager in 2022.
