Deployment

During October DFES will issue an expression of interest for those wanting to participate and be included in the 2021-22 Deployment Register.

The Deployment Register captures the details of those who may be called upon for Intrastate, Interstate and International travel should additional resources be requested or required for an emergency response.

SES volunteers wanting to put themselves forward for any of the deployment options will need to complete and submit the nomination form, include their preferences and enter current competencies.

Volunteers may be subject to completing a predeployment medical questionnaire or undergo medical checks prior to being deployed and if selecting the 'international' option, must have a valid passport with at least 6 months currency available.

Nomination forms should be provided to your Local Manager for endorsement.

Please note, there is no penalty or scrutiny for any member should they be called upon and not be in a position to be deployed at that particular time.

- The SES Training Product Developer selection process in nearing completion which will enhance the capacity of Learning & Development to complete SES related training products for the duration of the contract.

State Emergency Service

1st July, 1959

Issued by Authority of Under Secretary, Premier's Department, Perth

STATE EMERGENCY SERVICE

(1) FUNCTION

The State Emergency Service has been created to cope with civil disasters, including fires, floods, cyclones, railway accidents, crashed aircraft, explosions and search for lost persons.

The Service will supplement and not replace normal local or departmental action. Control of specialised measures such as fire fighting or railway accidents will not be removed from existing responsible authorities.

(2) OPERATION

The Service will come into operation only on the order of the Commissioner of Police, who will first confer with the Under Secretary, Premier's Department, if time permits.

(3) PROCEDURE

(a) The Senior Police Officer at the scene of the emergency will assume control and assess the situation in the light of local assistance which is available. Information as to local resources in manpower and equipment will have been submitted to the District Police Officer by each country local authority. When satisfied that the resources available are likely to be inadequate to meet the situation, the Police Officer will notify the Commissioner and request further assistance. The particular type of aid required and all details of the situation must be specified.

(b) The Commissioner will despatch a senior officer to the scene of the emergency with such assistance as is necessary. This officer will assume control of the situation; further action will depend upon his reports.

(4) RESOURCES

Plant and Equipment resources which can be made available from the various authorities are set out herein. Authorities concerned will be also responsible for providing operators for specialist equipment.

(5) AIR SEARCHES

The Department of Civil Aviation, through its Control Operation Branch, will co-ordinate all aerial searches. Requests for the use of aircraft will be accepted by the Department of Civil Aviation only from the Commissioner of Police or one of his officers. The Civil Aviation Department will advise on the suitability and availability of aircraft, together with chartering costs and will make appropriate recommendations to the Commissioner of Police who will be responsible for engaging aircraft.

(6) MANPOWER

Manpower will be called upon in the following order :-

- (i) Local and departmental.
- (ii) Armed Services.
- (iii) Volunteer.

Interested organisations listed at page 4, have been invited to organise volunteer manpower and to maintain a register of personnel available with the Commissioner of Police.

Where the organisation providing manpower cannot provide transport, other agencies will be invited to co-operate. The organisations have been requested to submit the names and telephone numbers of their responsible officials to the Commissioner of Police who will call upon them as required. Responsibility for assembly, despatch, movement and control of members will remain with voluntary organisations until the Commissioner of Police or his representative, assumes control at the scene of the emergency.
