
Two young SES volunteers chosen to represent WA on May 1st in Canberra

The WA Young Emerging Leader's Program is aligned with the National SESVA YEL Program which aims to provide development opportunities for young SES volunteers. While in Canberra Jack and Lilika will join other young SES emerging leaders and meet the Governor-General and Commissioners from emergency services around the nation.

Deployments to Queensland and New South Wales continue

On 13th March Premier Roger Cook saw off WA's second team of emergency services personnel heading to Queensland to help with the recovery after ex-Tropical Cyclone Alfred.

Premier Cook stated, "on behalf of the people of Western Australia, thank you for supporting our friends and family on the east coast — stay safe, and we look forward to welcoming you back home soon."

The Emergency Services Minister added, "this morning I joined the Premier to see off this second group of Western

Australia's emergency services personnel heading to Queensland. We are grateful to them for supporting communities in need over east and wish them a safe trip."

To DEET or not to DEET with PPC?

On completing the online form for Operational Deployment, a volunteer was referred to DFES Directive 2-04 which states, "insect repellent is to be *non DEET."* On querying this with DFES they were advised:

"DEET is highly flammable and can negate the flame resistant properties of fire fighting clothing actually making the garment flammable. However, even though SES PPC is made of a somewhat fireresistant material, it is not a certified fire garment sold by Stuart & Heaton."

The conundrum raised being: whether to risk Murray Valley Encephalitis without DEET or increased flammability with it.

Pingelly SES had a recent change in leadership, with Susan Wettenhall-Fischer taking the reins from SES stalwart, Bill Mulroney ESM.

While the unit is small in numbers, it fills a big role in its community including road crash rescue, for which the unit has a purpose designed tender that is a marvel to behold. The Unit attends as many road crashes incidents as storm and search callouts.

SESVA Discussion Paper: the future of SES training in WA

Local Managers have until 13th April to provide their units' feedback about the training Discussion Paper sent to units in February .

SESVA Visits Pilbara SES Units: Issues raised by Local Managers

SESVA President Greg Cook and Secretary Alan Hawke were joined by Management Committee Pilbara representative, Trevor Patton on a tour of SES Units including Port Hedland, Roebourne, Tom Price, Newman and Karratha.

Common topics of conversation included Fit for Role, Training, Local Government Grant Scheme, Recruitment, PPC and Uniforms, and Incident Management protocols. Comments included:

LGGS:

- Process is documented on the DFES website under LGGS Grants Manual of Operation Procedures.
- LGGS funding identified VFES units as having Natural Hazards role responses but many of these units don't have a lot of SES type training and have limited capabilities.

PPC/Uniforms:

- The lightweight uniform rollout has not been changed to suit women.
- Some female members are making their own dress trousers because of fitting issues. They have been advised to seek reimbursement through their DO.
- DFES has indicated a commitment to provision of suitable PPC for women however have provided no time frame.
- Issue of PPC should be specific to a region's climate conditions.

Recruitment and Retention:

 Building membership difficult due to transient nature of communities and prevalence of 12 hour shifts in the mining community.



Training:

- Lack of Trainer Assessors within unit membership. Interunit training problematic due to travel distances.
- Maintaining ongoing training therefore difficult.
- Currently no members trained in swift water rescues.
- National training no longer supported by DFES and not being recognised as RPL. DFES recognition of RPLs would go a long way to retain members.
- Continuation training is difficult for members to maintain the 90 day requirements where they have multiple skill sets.
- Regional Training Calendar is impacted by membership work rosters. More online training modules will be beneficial.
- It's important for units to ensure they promote training nominations else DFES will cancel training courses.
- Some employers don't release members for training courses.

Fit for Role:

- Some SES units will not accept FFR until more detailed information is provided and rolled out across all volunteer groups not just SES.
- New member application form now includes FFR assessment and if signed is a legally binding document that could be detrimental for future injury claims should previous injuries not be disclosed.
- Mental health needs to be considered as part of FFR assessment.

Did you know? AMSA and SAR

The Australian Maritime Safety Authority (AMSA) provides search and rescue to any person in distress in the Australian search and rescue region.

AMSA uses advanced response and satellite technology, contracted equipment, an emergency towage vessel and four jet aircraft to respond to calls for help.

The Australian Search and Rescue (SAR) arrangements provide specialist search and rescue capability delivered by government, non-government and volunteer organisations in the largest search and rescue region in the world.

The design and provision of Australia's national SAR service has developed over time to meet the geographic and cultural needs of our nation.

Due to the challenges of a large land mass, small population and active lifestyle, Australia has established a cooperative SAR arrangement between AMSA, the state and territory police and the Australian Defence Force.

These three organisations make up our SAR authorities, with other organisations acting in support including volunteers.

The National Search and Rescue (NATSAR) Council is the national coordinating body for SAR response arrangements made up of the entities as shown in the NATSAR council logo (right).
