# SES Volunteer Advisory Committee (SES VAC)



On Wednesday, July 5, a new and invigorated SES Volunteer Advisory Committee met with Minister Stephen Dawson and DFES Commissioner, Mr Darren Klemm, at Dumas House. This was, for many attendees, their first time at Dumas House to meet with a Minister of the Crown and the establishment of the VAC.

Minister Dawson chaired this meeting which was convened to walk through and understand the Western Australian Governments' "Statement of Expectation". The Chair of the VAC was also elected from the twelve successful nominees that were appointed through recommendation and supported by State

Cabinet. The Committee members are appointed for a three-year period.

The Statement of Expectation recognises that the Committee has the responsibility to provide advice to Minister Dawson and the DFES Commissioner, including;

- Engaging in matters of strategic importance relevant to your volunteer service that will inform the agenda.
- ◆ Providing recommendations about significant issues which are evidence-based and supported by research.
- Forsee significant issues impacting emergency services, broader readiness and service delivery, and emergency management services volunteering.
- Produce and publish an annual summary that provides an overview of key items or outcomes produced or contributed by the Committee.

Minister Dawson requires the Committee's combined knowledge and experience in contributions and functions to be future-focused and goal-orientated, with a view to contributing to enhance and advance emergency services volunteering.

Mr. Greg Cook was elected by the Committee members to the role of Chair. The Association through the Chair will seek permission to publish the names of those SES volunteers that have formed the SES Volunteer Advisory Committee.

### Local Government Grant Scheme

### **Capital Grants**

Most SES units are funded by the Local Government Grant Scheme (LGGS). Details and FAQs can be found at <a href="https://www.dfes.wa.gov.au/emergency-services-levy">https://www.dfes.wa.gov.au/emergency-services-levy</a>. We are informed that the framework for the LGGS has been 'drafted, utilising current governance structures'. <sup>1</sup> The SES Volunteers Association is not consulted on the framework or annual changes to the scheme.

Volunteer FES units are funded direct from DFES, as are some regional SES units. The governance rules around those funding arrangements falls under the Financial Management Act and Treasury Instructions. <sup>2</sup> Therefore, the following does not necessarily apply for those DFES funded units.

Along with operational grants, DFES also provides local governments with grants for capital expenditure. Capital grants are for vehicles, trailers and boats, new buildings and facilities, modifications to existing buildings and facilities, and major items of equipment costing more than \$5,000 per item.

Local governments must submit capital grant applications each year, usually by March, for the following financial year. All capital grant applications are collated and submitted to a capital grants committee for consideration.<sup>3.</sup>

It is therefore critical that SES unit management works collaboratively with their regional office and local government administration to have capital grants applied for each year in the prescribed form. The capital grant submission must be specific to the unit's endorsed role, for example storm damage. Capital grant applications will also need to be supported with a business case and written support of the regional superintendent. Don't be surprised if it takes repeated requests for a grant application to be approved.

Unfortunately, SES units are not advised by DFES on the success or otherwise of their applications. Approved applications are notified by DFES to the local government. Declined applications are not notified at all!

Many units have aging vehicles that are past their replacement date. The reality is that there are too many assets, new requests or requiring replacement, and too few funds to go around. DFES is also a relatively small government department and suppliers have bigger customers to satisfy. Unit managers will therefore need to work resolutely with their regional Natural Hazards District Officers for their unit to be prioritised ahead of other FES brigades, groups and units.
